
# **Voters' Health Care Priorities**

### New Mexico Voters Say Fixing Health Care Is a Top Priority

- New Mexico voters say health care is one of the top-two issues informing their vote this November.
- About 9 in 10 say improving health care should be a "top" or "major" priority for elected officials and they want them to do more to improve health care.
- New Mexico voters desire lower health fees and want their out-of-pocket costs to be more predictable.
- They want politicians and the private sector industry leaders to focus on policy reforms that make the health care system more affordable and the cost more transparent to consumers.



## Voters are frustrated by health costs

### Voters want transparency in costs

Percent of voters who want more of the following

84% Clarity on out of pocket costs at hospitals

Clarity on what health care providers and 83% medicines are covered by your insurance

Information on how often and why **82%** specific health treatments prescribed by a doctor are denied by insurers

Clarity on out of pocket costs for 77% prescriptions

## Broad support for real solutions

Percentage of voters want the following changes

Pharmacists should be able to inform **91%** customers at the point-of-sale of ways to save money on a prescription

Pharmaceutical companies, hospitals, and 89% health insurers should be more transparent about the cost and access to health care

**Pharmaceutical companies** should have to **81%** provide information about **drug costs and** financial assistance available to patients

Hospitals and clinics should be required to 77% show how much they are marking up the costs for standard treatments
